- Make your own hours

- Owner is a LANDLORD, and therefore not responsible for your business
- You are responsible for accounting and taxes

EMPLOYEE

- Clock in and clock out, your schedule is created for you
- Have to align with the services and mission of the company
- Your clientele is given to you by the company
- Company markets for you, you are limited on the marketing you can do for yourself.
- If you don't work, you don't collect a paycheck.
- Company is responsible for all expenses and supplies to do your job.
- You are paid hourly or commission based.
- You are an employee which means you report to a manager or owner.
- You have taxes paid for you out of your paycheck.
- Company is in charge of all emergency situations

At Firefly, even though we are landlord/booth renter style business, we still provide amenities to help you be successful! Although at the end of the day, these are just tools you have to use, you are still responsible for generating your own clientele, preparing for emergencies and paying rent.
